## Towards a sustainable gastronomy: Approaches and actions in restauration

GastronomiQc Lab first symposium will be held on **September 29-30, 2019 at the Centre** des Sciences de Montréal.

This scientific activity provides a unique opportunity for students, postdoctoral fellows, research professionals and other symposium participants **to showcase their research** to professionals from the gastronomy sector, institutional and government stakeholders, as well as fellow students and researchers.

All participants whose research theme is related to sustainable development in gastronomy or food sciences are invited to **present a poster or a short oral presentation** (approximately 3 minutes) for small audiences of rotating participants. A prize of \$ 250 will be awarded to the student poster or presentation selected by the public.

Students participation to this knowledge transfer event will showcase the excellence of the gastronomic sciences research in Quebec and Canada.

Since the symposium is aimed at both gastronomy professionals and scientists of all disciplines, you should pay special attention so that your presentation is well understood by all.

Abstracts will be accepted on the basis of their relevance by the organization committee.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE ABSTRACT

- The abstract must be sent in Word format (.doc or .docx);
- Font : Calibri size 11 ;
- Indicate on separate lines: Title, authors and affiliations:
  - o Title in uppercase and bold type;
  - o List all authors (Name Surname). Use authors' full names;
    - Identify the name of the presenter with an asterisk (\*);
    - Refer to affiliations by using superscript numbers (ex. <sup>1</sup>.)
  - o Authors' affiliations, numbered (without departments or postal addresses);
- The abstract must not exceed **300 words**;
- No table or diagrams allowed;
- Unjustified single-spaced text body;
- Email address for correspondence at the bottom of the page;
- Everything should fit on a 8½ x 11 page, with margins of at least 2 cm;
- Identify the file by your last name and the initial of your first name. For instance John Smith: SmithJ.doc.
- Specify in the email if you wish to make a poster or a short oral presentation.

The abstract must be written in French or English.

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR POSTERS

Poster size:  $90 \text{ cm} (3 \text{ ft}) \times 120 \text{ cm} (4 \text{ ft})$ , landscape or portrait orientation. The language used on the poster is at the author's discretion.

GastronomiQc Lab's students its logo must appear on their poster. It will be provided on request.

Panels for posters will be available in the hall next to the Perspective room at the Centre des Sciences. Posters can be installed on your assigned panel either on **Sunday, September 29, between 13h3o and 15h** or on **Monday, September 30, before 9h0o**. <u>Poster sessions will take place during the breaks, lunch and closing cocktail on Monday, September 30</u>. There must always be one of the authors present during the sessions to provide explanations to







participants. Poster removal begins after the award ceremony which will take place at the end of the closing cocktail on September 30.

#### SHORT PRESENTATION INSTRUCTIONS

Communication format: 3 to 6 Power Point slides

Duration: 3 minutes

Audience: small attendees groups. All presentations will be held simultaneously during the poster/presentation session. Presenters must expect to repeat their presentation to several groups of participants.

GastronomiQc Lab's students its logo must appear on their presentation. It will be provided on request.

Cocktail tables will be placed in the hall next to the Perspective room at the Centre des Sciences. You will be assigned a table to install you laptop during the sessions. **You must bring your own computer**. Presentation sessions will be take place during the breaks, lunch and closing cocktail on Monday, September 30. There must always be one of the authors present at the sessions to present to the participants. Presentations end with the award ceremony that will take place at the end of the closing cocktail on September 30.
